AN ECO-FRIENDLY HOUSING DEVELOPMENT

ABOUT THE DEVELOPMENT

The ecological neighborhood is located on almost five acres on South Old Wire Road in Rogers. The land will accommodate 15 homes, providing shelter for 15 families.

WHAT IT COSTS

The neighborhood project is estimated to cost approximately \$2.1 million to complete, and includes:

- Land (4.68 acres) \$196,600
- Homes \$1,105,000
- Infrastructure \$700,000

WHO IS PAYING

Participation from the University of Arkansas was partially funded by a federal grant, and the remaining funds have been raised through various events, including galas and golf tournaments. Funds will continue to be raised through other community outreach efforts. The city of Rogers continues to support the project. We are also seeking sponsors for homes, landscaping and final phases of the neighborhood.

PROJECT HISTORY

Work on the infrastructure began in April of 2005, and the first home was dedicated on December 28, 2006. Home construction is expected to continue into 2023 before all homes are completed.



NWA'S FIRST ECO-NEIGHBORHOOD

Habitat for Humanity of Benton County, Inc. partnered with the University of Arkansas Ecological Engineering Department and Community Design Center to build Habitat Trails. The project is an entire neighborhood dedicated to preserving the environment.

A wetlands meadow, a community area and a small park are included in the plan. The design and construction will have minimal impact on the environment. The neighborhood incorporates conservation principles, including watershed management, land conservation, aquatic buffers, erosion and sediment control and storm water management practices.
